Read the following Scripture and answer the questions below.

1 The Israelites, however, were unfaithful regarding the things set apart for destruction. Achan son of Carmi, son of Zadbi, son of Zerah, of the tribe of Judah, took some of what was set apart, and the Lord's anger burned against the Israelites. 2 Joshua sent men from Jericho to Ai, which is near Beth-aven, east of Bethel, and told them, "Go up and scout the land." So the men went up and scouted Ai. 3 After returning to Joshua they reported to him, "Don't send all the people, but send about 2000 or 3000 men to attack Ai. Since the people of Ai are so few, don't wear out all our people there." 4 So about 3000 men went up there, but they fled from the men of Ai. 5 The men of Ai struck down about 36 of them and chased them from outside the gate to the quarries, striking down on the descent. As a result, the people's hearts melted and became like water. 6 Then Joshua tore his clothes and fell before the ark of the Lord with his face to the ground until evening, as did the elders of Israel; they all put dust on their heads. 7 "Oh, Lord GOD," Joshua said, "why did You ever bring these people across the Jordan to hand us over to the Amorites for our destruction? 8 If only we had been content to remain on the other side of the Jordan! What can I say, Lord, now that Israel has turned its back and run from its enemies? 9 When the Canaanites and all who live in the land hear about this, they will surround us and wipe out our name from the earth. Then what will You do about Your great name?" 10 Then the Lord said to Joshua, "Stand up. Why are you on the ground? 11 Israel has sinned. They have violated My covenant that I appointed for them. They have taken some of what was set apart. They have stolen, deceived, and put the things with their own belongings. 12 This is why the Israelites cannot stand against their enemies. They will turn their backs and run from

their enemies, because they have been set apart for destruction. I will no longer be with you unless you remove from you what is set apart. 13 Go and consecrate the people. Tell them to consecrate themselves for tomorrow, for this is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says: there are things that are set apart among you, Israel. You will not be able to stand against your enemies until you remove what is set apart.
