Read the article below and answer the questions that follow.

Piranhas are freshwater fish that live in the lakes and rivers of South America. They are on average about 20 cm to 30 cm in length, although some species, or types, grow up to 60 cm long. Piranhas have a reputation for attacking animals and even people. There are stories of schools of piranhas stripping a cow to the bone within minutes. But are these stories true? Piranhas have a single row of sharp, triangular teeth in their top and bottom jaws. The teeth are flat and pointed and are so hard and sharp that local people often use them to make tools and weapons. Piranhas have been known to bite people swimming in rivers, and sometimes cause injuries. They also steal fishermen's bait and damage nets and the fish caught in them. However, piranhas are omnivorous; they feed on seeds and fruit as well as insects and other river creatures. They

also eat other fish, even ones that are a little larger than themselves, although they usually eat dead fish or animals rather than killing live ones for food. There are many different species of piranha. The best-known is the red-bellied piranha, which has the sharpest teeth and the strongest jaws. This species hunts in large groups of about 100 fish. It has been known to attack large animals (such as cattle) and even people, however this is rare.
