So stunned was the farmer by the pig's actions that the idea of forbidding him to enter the house in the future never crossed his mind, especially because in the days that followed Ace behaved faultlessly. All he did was to watch a great deal of television. He damaged nothing and made no messes anywhere (for Farmer Tubbs had the sense always to leave the door to the garden open: he himself often did not bother to take off his boots when he came in, so a few muddy pig-trotter marks did not signify). And in the afternoon, before the farmer came in after finishing the afternoon milking, the pig would turn off the television with a prod of his snout, leave the house, and make his way back to the door of the box stall...

In fact, Ace was becoming very selective in his viewing. He had not been a house pig many days before he found out, first by chance and then by trial and error, that pressing each of the five knobs below the window of the magic box produced a different result. One turned the thing off, and the other four controlled four different channels, but he soon found out that the magic box offered a choice of pictures. His sense of time was good, too, and after a few weeks, his viewing had taken on a definite pattern.

By experimenting with the control knobs, Ace found what programs suited him and at what time of day. These were generally split into two parts: morning viewing and afternoon viewing. In between, he took a nice long nap, laying on the hearth rug. He had the sense not to attempt to get onto either of the armchairs.

For his morning watching -- that is, between the hours of roughly 9 a.m. and 11 a.m. -- he usually chose a program for schools called 'Daytime on Two' where there was a section called "Look and Read" and items on such as science and mathematics. All of these Ace found fascinating, though on occasion he would switch to Channel Four's 'Our World' which often had interesting information about food.

In the afternoon, say between 4 p.m. and 5:30 p.m., Ace enjoyed children's TV. There were always plenty of animals, both live and in cartoons, and their antics amused him.

But though the afternoon's viewing was fun, the morning's, because of his unique gift for understanding the human tongue, was, for Ace, highly educational, especially with regard to numbers and to language.

Quick to learn, Ace began to recognise simple words. There were, for instance, items about road safety, using diagrams with large lettering,

and soon Ace, had he been called upon, could have distinguished a sign that said STOP from one that said GO.

Soon, too, he acquired a basic grasp of figures, becoming aware, for example, that he had one snout, one tail, two eyes, two ears, and four legs, and that the sum of himself and the other two animals was three.
